INFORMATION

The Reform Club was founded in 1836, in Pall Mall, in the centre of what is often called London's Clubland. The founders commissioned a leading architect of the day, Charles Barry, to build an imposing and palatial clubhouse. It is as splendid today as when it opened in 1841.

Current membership encompasses an informed international audience rich and diverse in political and religious affiliations, professional and business interests, artistic and literary talent, age and nationality. Criteria for membership are character, talent and achievement.

Opening hours	The Clubhouse is open for members and their guests between 8 am and midnight every weekday. Those occupying Chambers are admitted to the clubhouse at weekends but please note there is no service after breakfast on Saturday and Sunday morning.
Dress code	Closed collar and tie and jacket for gentlemen and a corresponding degree of formality for ladies. Recognised national and religious dress and service dress uniform may be worn at any time. The dress code is relaxed at the weekend after breakfast on Saturday. The following are strictly prohibited: Denim and other jeans Tracksuits, leisure wear, shorts, leggings, jodhpur-style trousers and other similar attire T shirts, sweat shirts, cropped tops and similar casual attire Training shoes, hiking boots, deck shoes, flip-flops, sandals and other sports style footwear
Requirements for visiting reciprocal club members	A card, or letter of introduction must be presented at the Porters Lodge or an email may be sent in advance to: generaloffice@reformclub.com
Accepted methods of payment for the Club's facilities	Cash and cheques on UK bank accounts / Visa and MasterCard. Payment to be made prior to departure.
Smoking / vaping policy	Smoking or vaping is not permitted anywhere in the Clubhouse. Members may smoke outside in the Garden.
Mobile phones, tablets and laptops	Calls can be made in the booths in the Front Hall and the sitting room next to the Computer Room. Smart phones and tablets can be used throughout the Club for reading purposes. Wifi is available throughout the Club.

Chambers	The Reform has 49 bedrooms, comprising 15 singles, 15 singles with private bathrooms, 5 twin bedded rooms, 1 with a private bathroom and 11 double rooms, 7 with a private bathroom. Extensive Library	The Club has an extensive library of some 85,000 books, with most of the Club's public rooms book-lined. It is one of the largest private libraries in England
